

The Hedley Porphyry Gold Camp is located 280 kilometres east of Vancouver, BC, Canada. The camp is near the community of Hedley, the centre of gold mining from 1898 to 1996 that has produced 2.5 million ounces gold. The mines are situated on the north side of the Similkameen Valley at elevations ranging from 1700 to 1900 metres.

The Hedley Porphyry Gold Camp is situated in the Triassic Nicola Group sediment and volcanic rocks. The Hedley Porphyry Gold Camp contains three high grade gold mines that are the Nickel Plate, Gold Hope and French deposits along with three low grade gold mines that are the Canty, Bulldog and Sunnyside deposits. Within the camp, there are numerous low grade deposits, prospects and showings.

Goldcliff's porphyry gold deposits, the York-Viking and Nordic, contain low grade gold mineralization. Goldcliff's exploration target area covers 4 square kilometres and has numerous prospects and showings.
